TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

1. **The fundamental prerequisite** of being accepted to the bachelor's degree study programme (first degree) is the full completion of secondary education or full secondary vocational education (Higher Education Act, n.131/2002 Coll.).
2. **Language competence** – written and oral command of Slovak or Czech. Studying at the faculty, including the opportunity of spending a part of your study abroad, calls for a need of mastering at least one of the world languages in the range of grammar school curriculum (English, German, Spanish, French, Russian).
3. **Health certificates** – the faculty does not require any health certificates for university studies and accepts all the applications without any health certificates for all degrees of the university studies.
4. The faculty retains the right not to open the study program when the number of applicants is less than 10.



FORMS OF ADMISSION

Selection Procedure

- Admission procedure is carried out in a form of a selection procedure in order to ensure that the admitted candidates dispose of the necessary skills and abilities. The admission committee, on the basis of results of the entrance examination, determines the point limit with a minimum number of points (of total points) required for admission of an applicant.

Rules of Selection Procedure

MEDIAMATICS AND CULTURAL HERITAGE (full-time, part-time form of study):

All candidates submit a letter of motivation (maximum 1800 characters) where they indicate their motivation to study in the field of library and information science, their idea of the benefits of the study for themselves, previous experience with an area they intend to know more about by means of the study.

No entrance exams the faculty will accept all the applicants with an average secondary school results up to 2,0. The applicants who do not reach this average, will have to take a knowledge test from the subjects: the Slovak language and Literature, Citizenship Education/Civics and Informatics within the range of the secondary curriculum subjects. (Note: the Department of Mediamatics and Cultural Heritage of the Faculty of Humanities will carry out the entrance exam).

INTERCULTURAL AND INTERRELIGIOUS COMPETENCE AND MEDIATION

The applicants for the Bachelor's study programme Intercultural and Interreligious Competence and Mediation are admitted without entrance exams. Meeting the admission requirements stated for the first degree of higher education is assessed by the commission appointed and chaired by the Dean of the faculty. In the process of applicant's assessment the applicant's academic performance at secondary school with an emphasis on those subjects he/she wants to study and the results in the subjects relating to the basis of the selected study programmes (Philosophy, Ethics, Religion and Citizenship Education) play the crucial role.

TEACHER TRAINING STUDY PROGRAMMES (full-time, part-time form of study):

Teaching in combination with the English Language

The applicants are admitted **without entrance exams, based on the following criteria:**

For subjects in combination with the English language preference shall be given to those applicants who in the state school leaving examination succeeded in the external part at level B2 and achieved at least 60% and at level B1 at least 75%, further of importance are the applicant's academic performance at secondary school with an emphasis on those subjects he/she wants to study, and the results in the subjects relating to the basis of the selected study programmes; participation, respectively results in national and international rounds of the subject competitions (Olympiáda), secondary scientific activities (SOČ), state examinations and certificates of foreign languages are also taken into account. In case of equal number of points achieved it also is the overall grade average that determines the score.

The outcome of the external part of the school leaving exam in the English language will be multiplied by the coefficient as follows: Level B2 2 x %, reached by a student in the examination; Level B1: 1 x %, reached by a student in the examination.

Teaching in combination with Citizenship Education, single subject study programme Citizenship Education

The applicants are **admitted without entrance exams, based on the following criteria:**

- the applicant's academic performance achieved at a secondary school with an emphasis on those subjects the applicant wants to study (Social Sciences/Civics or Citizenship Education),
- the results in the subjects that create the basis of the selected study programmes,
- the school leaving exam results.

Other admission requirements:

- participation in and results of secondary school science activities (SOČ),
- participation or results in national and international rounds of the subject competitions (Olympiáda) relating to the study programme the applicant has submitted his/her application for.

Teaching in combination with Religious Studies

The applicants are **admitted without entrance exams, based on the following criteria:**

- complex results of the study at a secondary school and the school leaving exam results,
- the applicants who passed the school leaving exam in Social Sciences / Civics will be prioritized,
- participation, respectively results in subject competitions (Olympiáda), secondary school science activities (SOČ) - national and international rounds,
- with equal points the overall grade average.



ACCEPTANCE OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

For the applicants from abroad, the same admission requirements are applicable as for the applicants from Slovakia.

Foreign students who study in a foreign language (i.e. not Slovak), pay the tuition fee as stated in § 92 Subsection 8 (Higher Education Act). The tuition fee is specified by the UNIZA directive for the respective academic year, which can be found on the university website.

Students from abroad who study in the Slovak language do not have to pay the tuition fee. The applicants from the Czech Republic who want to apply and study in Žilina can use the application form available in the Czech Republic. The applicants who do not actively speak Slovak or Czech are required to attend the language training. (It is possible to attend the Slovak for Foreigners courses at UNIZA).

For foreign applicants who were accepted on the basis of international agreements or Slovak government grants, terms and conditions stated in respective agreements are applicable.



HOW TO APPLY

Application forms are to be submitted for individual study programmes.

In case the applicant is interested in more study programmes, it is necessary to apply for each one individually, including payment of the respective admission procedure fees.

Applicants have to fill in the form Prihláška na vysokoškolské štúdium - 1. stupeň or they can also use an electronic application form that can be found on the university website (<https://vzdelavanie.uniza.sk/prijimacky/index.php>) or on the education portal (<https://prihlaskavs.sk/sk/>).

Even in case of an electronic application form, it is required to print it, sign it, enclose other required documents including the proof of payment of the fee and send it to the address of the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA within the stipulated deadlines. Incomplete study application or application sent after the deadline will not be accepted.

In the absence of or failure of entrance exams, the faculty does not refund the admission fee.

If an applicant wants to take part in entrance exams at more faculties of UNIZA, the application forms have to be sent separately to each faculty and the respective admission procedure fees paid separately to each faculty.

Enclosures for the bachelor's degree programmes (to be sent with application forms):

- Curriculum Vitae,
- proof of payment of the admission fee,
- copies of annual secondary school certificates or more precisely a confirmation of the results of the study on the application form by the secondary school.

After passing the final secondary school exams, the applicants will send the copy of the final exam certificate as well as the copy of the last annual secondary school certificate. The deadline for sending these documents will be announced to all applicants individually by mail.

MEDIAMATICS AND CULTURAL HERITAGE

(Field of study 3.2.4 Library and Information Science)

The graduates can work in various business companies, in research, in advertising agencies, in libraries and archives.

INTERCULTURAL AND INTERRELIGIOUS COMPETENCE AND MEDIATION

(Field of study 2.1.16 Religion)

The graduated are primarily prepared for successful continuation of their studies at the second level of higher education. Thanks to the acquired language skills and knowledge reflecting the multiculturalism of the current modern society, they have wide application in the European labour market. They can work as experts able to effectively combine a wide range of knowledge of several areas: as coworkers in international companies and organisations, in the integration offices at state institutions focused on international cooperation and in diplomacy, in non-governmental international organisations dedicated to international cooperation, in the EU bodies, agencies and institutions, in the diplomatic service, civil service, departments for the affairs of churches and religious associations, in advisory institutions for governmental, political and social institutions, as cultural educators in cultural and religious institutions, institutions of educational character and in further education, in domestic and overseas editorial mass media houses, especially in the field of religious literature and literature dedicated to religions and cultures be it in an expert or popular way, as media consultants, consultants, speakers, editors, commentators, moderators, analysts, as interpreters and mediators in cultural and religious conflict situations, in museums and administration of religious subjects as well as objects.

TEACHING IN COMBINATION WITH THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE**(Field of study 1.1.1 Teaching Academic Subjects)**
